Anyone coming to us needs a personal reference from a surgeon.

- Intend to become a surgeon after graduation and send an accompanying reference from a surgeon
- Commit to a MINIMUM of 6 weeks with us
- Be able to work independently of anyone who might accompany you
- Be in the final year of your degree
- Send us a copy of your CV at info@csc.org and letter of reference from a surgeon
- When sending us your CV and a Letter of Reference, please also let us know which area of CSC's services interests you most (e.g., Orthopedics, ENT, Plastics/Reconstructive, Eye, etc.)
